(Olympia, WA, February 22, 2006) -- Lumbermens, a 65-store chain of contractor-focused building material centers in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, California and Arizona, announced today the purchase of substantially all of the assets of Arizona Building Supply, a three-unit chain based in northern and western Arizona.

M. David Dittmer, President of Lumbermens, stated that, "Arizona Building Supply is a great fit for our organization in that it strengthens our position in the important and growing Arizona market. With locations in Sedona, Cottonwood and Fort Mohave, they are a contractor-focused company with an excellent customer base. The Sedona and Fort Mohave locations are traditional lumber yards, while the Cottonwood location serves as a drywall distributor in the active Sedona/Cottonwood market."

"I am excited about the addition of Arizona Building Supply to the Lumbermens organization", said Paul Hylbert, President and CEO of Lanoga, the parent company of Lumbermens. "While adding distribution capability in a strong, growing market, we're also pleased to have the drywall supply business to increase the assortment of products and services we provide for our customers".

"Arizona Building Supply has a strong, experienced group of employees", said Dittmer. "The reputation for quality products and services developed by this team of capable people is a key element in our making this deal. We are looking forward to integrating these locations into our current operations which serve the Arizona market and are eager to expand on the platform they have developed".

Including Lumbermens, Seattle-based Lanoga Corporation operates 320 facilities in 24 Midwestern and Western States, including United Building Centers in the Midwest and Rocky Mountains, Spenard Builders Supply in Alaska, Home Lumber in Colorado, Dixieline Lumber Company in Southern California, Parker Lumber in Texas, and F. E. Wheaton & Company in Chicago. On February 1, 2006, Lanoga became part of the Fidelity Investments family, combining with the Strober Organization to form Pro-Build, Inc., a Pro Dealer with over 400 distribution and manufacturing locations with annual sales of over \$5 billion.
